

St Vigeans Church Newsletter February 2024

It is with very mixed feelings that I write these words. Within the next few days, a new chapter in the life of our historic church will begin. We will no longer be only St Vigeans Church, but we will become part of the new Arbroath and District Church of Scotland.

We all have happy memories with many of you have been members for a lot longer than I have, but we hope and pray that as we begin this new journey many more memories will be made.

On Page 4 of this Newsletter, you can read an article from Rev Chris Hay, Minister of the West Kirk, outlining the journey the Arbroath Churches have been on to arrive at this place.

However, I know that the question many of you are asking is what will this change mean for us? This is a very difficult question to answer, and I think that no matter what is decided in the short term may very well vary in the longer term. Unfortunately, I can give you some information but there are many, many areas where my answer is "I have no idea!!"

Trying to remain positive, some things I do know. We will still have a service in St Vigeans most Sundays and Keith will remain as our Locum for the next four months after the Union. Thereafter, as soon as possible, a new minister will be called to the United Church, who will primarily be responsible for St Vigeans and St Andrews Churches.

After the Union there will only be one Session, with a team of Session Clerks, and although all our existing Elders will become part of this new session, the exact structure is still to be decided. Again, although a great deal of the administration will become centralised, people from all the churches in the group will be required to serve on these new centralised committees for finance, property, communication, safeguarding, and others.

However, although St Vigeans, as a Worshipping Centre, will still be able to retain some of it's own identity, we will also be financially accountable for our share to the group and we will require groups, committees and people to look after the day to day running of our Church - arranging rotas, orders of service, pastoral care, mission. outreach, fun club, stewardship (including fund raising), social, hall, property and other areas I have omitted. These groups will be required to put forward reports etc to the Session - just as we did for board & session meetings.

Perhaps also we will need some sort of organiser/ co-ordinator to hold all these things together!!

Our groups - Guild, Fun Club, Be Creative, Bible Study & Toddlers etc will remain unchanged.

What is certain is that you, our members and those who attend our services, are our future and you are all so important to us. We will still need you all in the life of the new united Church. Without your support, in so many different ways, it will be impossible to continue and move forward.

Sadly, this is nothing like the full picture of what we are or do as a Church but slowly, hopefully over the next few months, it will all become clearer. Again, some of this information may turn out to be incorrect - apologies in advance - but hopefully it may have answered some of your concerns. For me and I know many of you, the thing that we must retain throughout all these changes and indecision is our happy, welcoming Church Family.

This is my last letter to you as your Session Clerk. I have been in the post for eleven years and have seen many changes. Initially, Nelu was our minister, and we were linked to Knox's Church. Nelu left in 2017, the linkage was severed in 2019 and we went into Guardianship. Since then, we have had three Interim Moderators - Rev Dale London, Rev Dolly Purnell and for the last 5 years Rev Peter Phillips. We have also had a number of different Locums but for over 5 years we have been fortunate to have Keith. A huge thank you to Keith! We also somehow managed to cope with Covid and all the challenges it brought!

Lastly, can I please express my thanks to so many of you who have helped me in so many different ways over these years? No matter how many meetings or discussions I have had over this time, I was always only there as your representative and always did and agreed to whatever I believed was best for St Vigeans.

There will be changes, of that there is no doubt, but please remain positive and with God's guidance we will all be one.

Towards Arbroath and District Church of Scotland....

At the end of 2022 the Presbytery Mission Plan for the Arbroath and area cluster of churches was approved by Presbytery and the appropriate committees of the central church. This plan approved the union of all nine churches in the cluster – Arbirlot, Carmyllie, Colliston, Friockheim & Kinnell, Inverkeilor, Old & Abbey, St Andrew's, St Vigeans and West Kirk.

2023 was therefore a year in which we worked hard to implement the plan by;

- 1. Creating a transition team to facilitate the legal process involved in creating the union, including deciding on a name.
- 2. Providing activities to build relationships Walk and talks to churches, joint bible studies, prayer evenings bearing in mind that in weeks like Easter Code and Bubblegum & Fluff we are already working together.
- 3. United services of worship in the summer and at harvest and Christmas time.

In June 2023 we held the first congregational vote. As 2 of the 9 congregations didn't vote in favour of the union, we took some time and offered Question & Answer sessions to try to address concerns and to listen to other voices. Perth Presbytery were then involved in the decision to hold a second vote, this time involving 8 churches, providing Arbirlot with a little more time to make a decision. The second vote was held in December and was approved with a resounding majority.

Since that time progress has been rapid. The Union has been approved by Perth Presbytery and the central church. OSCR (the charities regulator) has been informed and it is their role to legally bring the eight charities into one body. The date for the union has been set as the 29th February and there will be a Presbytery-led service on Thursday 29th February to effect this at 7pm in St Andrew's Church. Once the union takes place all elders from the eight legacy congregations will form the new Kirk Session.

Already many people in church teams – session clerks, finance, property, safeguarding, roll keepers, elders and more have been getting together to work out how to establish new structures to operate a united congregation operating in 6 worshipping centres and one mission centre. It's not a small task and we won't get everything right first time but the ministry team (Peter, Carla and myself) are so grateful for all the time, effort and enthusiasm that is being given and shown and the support we are receiving from Perth Presbytery. We are also meeting with present locums and our invaluable staff to reassure them of their value to us and make sure we secure their roles in the new organisation correctly.

Following the union, we are planning a united service to celebrate. On Sunday 24th March (Palm Sunday) we welcome the Moderator of the General Assembly, the Rt Rev Sally Foster-Fulton and her husband to lead us in worship and we will share in Holy Communion together followed by lunch. This will be at the West Kirk at 11am.

Please pray for all involved in the coming weeks and months as a new structure is established and that this coming together of people will provide the foundation for more opportunities to share God's love with the people of this area.

Our thoughts and prayers are with the family and friends of Jim Muirhead, Morag McDonald, Jean McPhail and Mary Esplin who have all died recently.






GIFT SUNDAY



Reflection

Go! By Talitha Arnold

Now the Lord said to Abram, "Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you." - Genesis 12:1 (NRSV)

Each January, Pulitzer Prize winning columnist Mary Schmich invites her readers to pick a guiding word for the year—an idea that came from a reader named Mae. Mary is clear it is not a resolution nor a goal, but simply a word to shape the 365 days ahead. In 2016, Mary's word was "pause." As 2021 began and the pandemic continued, it was "endurance."

Mary's readers often send her their words. A class of fourth graders chose "kindness." For some high schoolers, their words ranged from "balance" and "self-acceptance" to "wanderlust" and "ataraxia." (Mary said she had to look it up. I did, too.)

Ancient Abram's word had to have been "go," as in: "Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house." Go from all that was familiar and comfortable. But also "go" from that which no longer brought life. Abram's father Terah had died in that land and that house. His journey was over. Abram's wasn't. "Go," God said.

"Go." It's not as long as other words and probably not as deep or profound. Yet I want "go" to be my guiding word for the days ahead. I'd like it to guide the congregation I serve, too, as we continue to figure out what it means to be the church—to be faithful—in this time. "Go," even if we don't know where the journey will lead. "Go," even if we seldom see the way ahead. "Go," because we can trust the One who goes with us.

Prayer

Lord, thank you for the new journey ahead. Help us to trust that you go with us every step of the way. Amen.

So overall giving down on last year by £1,122.01 or 2.54%. However, the various events we had throughout the year raised £4,739 and thanks to this and reduced expenditure mainly due to a lower contribution being required centrally a surplus of £3,687.45 was achieved for the year.

As indicated in the last newsletter 2023 saw a considerable amount of necessary works done to the Hall and the infrastructure to the area surrounding the church in preparation for installation of a toilet and baby changing facility inside the church this year. Total spending on the various works in 2023 totalled £97,380 and in 2024 it is expected a minimum of a further £42,340 will be needed to cover the planned works and for the painting of the exterior of the hall which has now been completed.

Obviously, this level of spending has had a significant impact on the overall funds held by the church with overall funds held of £203,514 excluding £54,746 ring-fenced for Music under a legacy and £4,228 held in the Charitable Trust. Once this year's works are completed hopefully there will be no major spends for some time and we can re-build the finances to a more comfortable level.

This will be my last report to the St Vigeans Newsletter but as I am going to be Treasurer of the new Arbroath & District Church no doubt you will hear from me again in whatever format communication looks like going forward. It has been a privilege to serve as your Treasurer and I will continue to do so albeit now as part of our bigger Church family.


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
