


St Vigeans Church Newsletter December 2023

In our last few Newsletters I have given you a brief history of St Vigeans Church and now I can tell you that a new chapter will begin within the next few months!

Initially, as outlined in the Presbytery Mission Plan, it was hoped that nine churches in the Arbroath Cluster, both town and country, would unite to become Arbroath and District Church of Scotland with six Worshipping Centres. Following the results of feasibility studies, these will be the existing buildings of West Kirk, St Andrews, St Vigeans, Carmyllie, Inverkeilor and a suitable venue to be decided in Friockheim. The Old & Abbey halls will be retained to create a Mission Centre and Colliston, Arbirlot, Friockheim and Old & Abbey church buildings will close together with the halls at Arbirlot and Inverkeilor.

At the first vote in June all nine congregations voted on both the Basis of Union and Basis of Team Ministry with seven voting in favour and two against these proposals. After many meetings and discussions to attempt to find an acceptable way forward it was decided to hold another vote, but this time Arbirlot, who voted no, would not be included.

This vote took place on 3rd December with all eight voting congregations voting in favour.



On a day to day basis what will this mean for St Vigeans? There is still a great deal to be discussed and decided upon and these discussions will be held early next year with the Union taking place soon after.

I do not want to give you false or inaccurate information, but I can tell you that all members of the eight congregations will become members of the new united church, all existing elders will form one new Session with one Session Clerk team, one Treasurer team and all funds, with the exception of restricted funds, will be pooled. A new minister will be appointed to join the Ministry Team, but this cannot happen until after the Union.

One thing that I am sure of is that although there will be changes there will still be roles, duties and responsibilities for everyone, and we will still need everyone's support for St Vigeans. Our Church family is important in many different ways and let us pray that this family is extended to include all in the new united church.

I will keep you as well informed as I can, but please if you want to ask anything you know where to find me and I will try to allay your fears.

There will be changes of that there is no doubt but please remain patient and positive and with God's guidance we will all be one.

REFLECTION

By the time you read this, St Andrew's Day, November 30th, will have come and gone, but his Scotland connection with is interesting. Andrew was the first of the Apostles to be called by Jesus to be a disciple. He was a fisherman in Galilee, and brother to Peter who would become leader of the disciple band. It was Andrew who introduced to Jesus the boy who had five loaves and two fishes before Jesus miraculously fed the huge crowd with these. It is said that Andrew took the new Christian faith to Asia Minor, modern day Turkey, before being crucified by the Romans for preaching this new religion. His request to be crucified on an x-shaped cross because he felt unworthy to die in exactly the same form as Jesus, was granted. Three hundred years after his death the Roman Emperor Constantine, the first Christian Emperor, moved his bones to his capital city Constantinople, now called Istanbul. A Greek monk had a dream when he was told to take Andrew's bones to the ends of the earth, and having removed some of his bones, he was shipwrecked off the east coast of Scotland. A church was built to house them and in the twelfth century St Andrew's Cathedral was erected on the site. Sadly, the original bones were lost, but it may indeed be that somewhere in Scotland lie some of the bones of that great first disciple. In more senses than one, Andrew may indeed be somewhere among us.

What a transformation took place when the Holy Spirit came; the disciples became bold witnesses for Jesus, standing up and preaching the Gospel. "For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans to prosper you and not to harm you. Plans to give you hope and a future".

So as all the planning and preparation continues, let us make sure we are always looking to Jesus and following His clear instructions.

It has been a real encouragement to work with staff in Inverbrothock School as part of their Religious and Moral Education, talking through the topics of Friendship and Kindness, with good interaction with the pupils. I have also been able to share with them the different aspects of church and they look forward to visiting church in the better weather.

As we approach Christmas, may we not get so caught up in all the preparation that goes into it, that we forget the real reason for Christmas. To many it has become a season of parties and presents, yet we give thanks for the greatest gift of all - when our Heavenly Father gave us His Son, Jesus to be our Saviour.

We have been carrying out a number of necessary and planned improvements to the church and hall over the year and by the end of the year we will have completed the following:

Early next year we will be adding a disabled toilet and baby changing facility inside the church costing approx. $\pounds 35k$ so total spending of $\pounds 121k$ which will obviously have a significant impact on the overall funds held by the Church but will leave us in a very good place to build for the future as part of the Arbroath Cluster of Churches.


